**Assoc. Professor Joseph Slaughter, Columbia University**

Joseph Slaughter is associate professor of English and Comparative Literature at Columbia University, where he teaches and in the fields of postcolonial literature and theory, African, Caribbean, and Latin American literatures, narrative theory, and human rights. His publications include articles in *Alif*, *Human Rights Quarterly*, *Research in African Literatures*, *The Journal of Human Rights*, *Politics and Culture*, *Comparative Literature Studies*, and *PMLA*. He is a founding coeditor of *Humanity: An International Journal of Human Rights, Humanitarianism, and Development*. He is the recipient of a number of prestigious prizes and fellowships, including a Guggenheim Fellowship (2009). His first book, *Human Rights, Inc.: The World Novel, Narrative Form, and International Law* (Fordham, 2007) was awarded the 2008 René Wellek prize for comparative literature and cultural theory. He is currently completing two books: *New World Orders*, on intellectual property and world literature, and *Pathetic Fallacies*, which revises the standard history of international human rights law by taking account of the roles that colonialism, corporations, and corporate personhood played in the establishment of an international legal order and the juridical categories that later made human rights
